Proudly serving the Communities of: Berea, Brook Park, Middleburg Heights, Olmsted Falls, Olmsted Township, Strongsville, in addition to the Cleveland Metropolitan Park District and the Ohio State Patrol Pursuant to Section 1901.14(A)(4) of the Ohio Revised Code, the Berea Municipal Court herewith submits its 50th Annual Report for the year 2008. The contents of this report are based on data assembled and tabulated by Raymond J. Wohl, the Clerk of Court and his staff of Deputy Clerks. This report reflects the financial and statistical activity of the Court in detail with respect to all political subdivisions within the Court district.

The Berea Municipal Court has been located in the City of Berea, by an act of the Ohio Legislature, since 1958. The Court district boundaries cover an area of 60.8 square miles and has a total population of 118,125 (per 2000 U.S. Census).

The Court serves the cities of Berea, Brook Park, Middleburg Heights, Olmsted Falls, Olmsted Township, Strongsville, in addition to the Ohio Turnpike (Ohio State Patrol) in Strongsville, Berea, and Olmsted Township; Interstate 71 (Ohio State Patrol) in Brook Park, Middleburg Heights, and Strongsville; and the Cleveland Metropolitan Park System within the Berea Municipal Court's boundaries.

It is with great pleasure that we present to you the 2008 Berea Municipal Court Annual Report.

Highlights

2008 was a year that reflected the state of the local and national economy in our Civil Department. The Civil Department had 4,245 new filings compared to 3,802 for 2007, an 11.6% increase, and we believe this trend will continue in 2009.

Our Traffic/Criminal Department results showed an increase in new filings of 2.5% compared to 2007. The overall increase in new filings was accomplished even though 5 of 7 reporting agencies within our jurisdiction had a decrease in new cases filed.

During 2008 the Berea Municipal Court received in excess of \$113,000 for 774 waiver payments through the use of the Court website. The availability of this resource provides convenience to violators saving a trip to Court to make a payment in person. In addition, our website had over 175,000 visits in 2008 with over 2.8 million pages being accessed in those visits.

As in the past, the Court on the Road initiative was continued at Strongsville High School and Midpark High School with the junior and senior class students observing live Court as it was conducted in the school auditorium. This allows the students the opportunity to observe actual cases heard by the Berea Municipal Court and affords them the opportunity to interact with the Judge and Clerk of Courts during a question and answer period.

Our economy continues to have a negative impact on our ability to collect fines and costs. In 2008 we continued a semi-monthly hearing schedule specifically for defendants with

outstanding fines and costs. The purpose of these hearing is to allow for regular payments to be made thereby avoiding more serious collection proceedings. Additionally, the Court processed 723 garnishments (35% increase over 2007) and 723 bank attachments (8% increase over 2007) related to civil judgments.

We also welcomed the opportunity to work, in a positive manner, with Mayor Cyril Kleem in his first year as Mayor. His cooperation and leadership led to an easing of the space constraints of the Court by allowing the relocation of our Probation Department and an expansion of our Jury/ Prosecutors Room.

The improved relationship opened the way for a metal detector to be installed at the building entrance and to provide the Clerk's Office and Courtroom greater security. This increase in security provides greater safety for all employees and visitors to the Court and Berea City Hall.

A heartfelt thank you to the entire staff including our Acting Judges, Magistrates, staff of the Traffic/ Criminal Division, Civil Division, Probation and Bailiffs, for the outstanding job they provided in 2008. Our staff of Deputy Clerks are truly professionals and complete their work in an efficient and business-like manner, and are ever mindful of the people we serve.

Thank you to Mayor Cyril Kleem, his directors, staff and Berea City Council, Police Chief Mark Schultz and his officers for their support. We appreciate your kindness, the confidence you have in us and your cooperation with us in the administration of the Berea Municipal Court.

In conclusion, you can rest assured that we will continue to monitor and evaluate the operations and expenses of the Court and to ensure that that the Berea Municipal Court is operated in a fiscally responsible and business-like manner.

SECTION FIVE COMMUNITY CONTROL

2008 COMMUNITY CONTROL SANCTIONS REPORT

The Community Control Department continues to maintain a staff of three full time employees and one part-time employee. The department continues to utilize non-paid part time interns. Four students interned throughout the year. The interns are obtained from local colleges such as Baldwin-Wallace, ITT, and Bryant and Stratton and the students are often majoring in Psychology and/or Criminal Justice.

The Community Control Officers supervised, as directed by the Court, approximately 1976 defendants during 2008. Approximately 1,201 of those defendants were drug and/or alcohol offenses and 785 were supervised from driving under suspension offenses. Approximately 245 defendants were supervised for theft and other property related offenses and 389 were for domestic violence and other violent crimes. Often the defendants are charged with multiple crimes and are placed on probation for these offenses.

At the direction of the Judge, the Community Control Department continues to utilize many social service agencies and support groups within the community and is continually adding more resources for the defendant. In 2008, the Probation Department has seen an increase in the number of 72 hour Driver Intervention Programs. The Probation Department has also increased the usage of the Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) Driver Awareness Sessions.

The Driving Under Suspension (DUS) diversion program continues to assist defendants in getting their driver's license reinstated. This year approximately 113 defendants reinstated their license with help of the program. The First Offender Diversion Program also saw an increase in referrals with approximately 57 defendants taking advantage of the opportunity to amend their behavior and avoid having a criminal conviction on their record. As part of the First Offenders Program, defendants have the option of participating in the Food Intervention Program. This program has the defendants purchase items on a pre-determined shopping list and then donate the goods to the local food banks. This enables the defendants to give back to the community. They also have the opportunity to donate their time through Community Service Work at the local non-profit agencies.

The Berea Municipal Court continues to be one of the locations for the Mother's Against Drunk Driving Driver Awareness Sessions. These sessions include five tiers that cover various topics such as alcohol education and victim and family impact. The cost of the program is \$25.00 for each tier and the proceeds go directly to MADD to assist victims of alcohol related driving offenses. Approximately 366 defendants were referred to the MADD Driver Awareness Sessions.
