Proudly serving the Communities of: Berea, Brook Park, Middleburg Heights, Olmsted Falls, Olmsted Township, Strongsville, in addition to the Cleveland Metropolitan Park District and the Ohio State Patrol Pursuant to Section 1901.14(A)(4) of the Ohio Revised Code, the Berea Municipal Court herewith submits its 52nd Annual Report for the year 2010. The contents of this report are based on data assembled and tabulated by Raymond J. Wohl, the Clerk of Courts and his staff of Deputy Clerks. This report reflects the financial and statistical activity of the Court in detail with respect to all political subdivisions within the Court district.

The Berea Municipal Court has been located in the City of Berea, by an act of the Ohio Legislature, since 1958. The Court district boundaries cover an area of 60.8 square miles and have a total population of 121,538 (per 2010 U.S. Census).

The Court serves the cities of Berea, Brook Park, Middleburg Heights, Olmsted Falls, Olmsted Township, Strongsville, in addition to the Ohio Turnpike (Ohio State Patrol) in Strongsville, Berea, and Olmsted Township; Interstate 71 (Ohio State Patrol) in Brook Park, Middleburg Heights, and Strongsville; and the Cleveland Metropolitan Park System within the Berea Municipal Court's boundaries.

It is with great pleasure that we present to you the 2010 Berea Municipal Court Annual Report.

Highlights

2010 was a year that again reflected the state of the local and national economy in our Civil Department. Although we saw a slight decrease in the number of new cases filed in our Civil Department, collection actions on outstanding judgments increased by 17.4% compared to 2009. Our Traffic/Criminal Department results showed a slight decrease in new filings compared to 2009.

Our economy continues to have a negative impact on our ability to collect fines and costs. In 2010 we continued a semi-monthly hearing schedule specifically for defendants with outstanding fines and costs. The purpose of these hearings is to allow for regular payments to be made, thereby avoiding more serious legal ramifications. We were successful in collecting over \$235,000 at these hearings, with over 3,000 payments being made.

Despite the reductions in new filings we are proud of the fact that the Berea Municipal Court revenues again exceeded expenses for 2010. Included in this was a nearly 8% reduction in overall expenses compared to the two year period back to 2008.

In 2010, the Clerk of Courts and his staff participated in the Fugitive Safe Surrender Program sponsored by the United States Marshall and the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department. During this four day program, conducted at Mount Zion Church, fugitives were given the opportunity to report and have outstanding warrants removed provided arrangements were made to appear in the Court holding their charges. The Berea Municipal Court had 41 fugitives appear.

During 2010 the Berea Municipal Court received \$100,850 for 663 waiver payments through the use of the Court website. The availability of this resource continues to provide convenience to violators by saving the trip to Court to make a payment in person.

As in the past, the Court on the Road initiative was continued at Strongsville High School with the Junior and Senior class government students observing live Court as it was conducted in the school auditorium. This allows the students the opportunity to observe actual cases heard by the Berea Municipal Court and affords them the opportunity to interact with the Judge and Clerk of Courts during a question and answer period.

We would like to extend a sincere thank you to the entire staff including our Acting Judges, Magistrates, staff of the Traffic/Criminal Division, Civil Division, Probation and Bailiffs for the outstanding service they provided in 2010. Our staff of Deputy Clerks are truly professionals and complete their work in an efficient and business-like manner and are ever mindful of the people we serve.

Thank you to Mayor Cyril Kleem, his directors, staff and Berea City Council, Police Chief Mark Schultz and his officers for their support. We appreciate your kindness, the confidence you have in us and your cooperation with us in the administration of the Berea Municipal Court.

In conclusion, you can rest assured that we will continue to monitor and evaluate the operations and expenses of the Court so that the Berea Municipal Court is operated in a fiscally responsible and business-like manner.

SECTION FIVE COMMUNITY CONTROL

2010 COMMUNITY CONTROL SANCTIONS REPORT

The Community Control Department continues to maintain a staff of four full time employees and one part-time employee. The department continues to utilize non-paid part time interns. Four students interned throughout the year. The interns are obtained from local colleges such as Baldwin-Wallace, ITT, and Bryant and Stratton and the students are often majoring in Psychology and/or Criminal Justice.

In 2010, 2005 cases were referred to the Community Control Department. The Community Control officers supervised, as directed by the Court, 777 cases for drug and/or alcohol offenses and 393 were supervised for driving under suspension offenses. 198 defendants were supervised for theft and other property related offenses and 237 were for domestic violence and other violent offenses. There were 92 other defendants that were supervised for other various offenses, such as, but not limited to, Dogs at Large, Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor, and Public Indecency. These numbers do not include the offenders that are given the option of the Driving under Suspension Diversion Program and the First Offender Diversion Program. Often the defendants are charged with multiple crimes and are placed on probation for multiple offenses. As an alternative to jail, 137 defendants were given the opportunity to complete 10 hours of community service work for every one day of jail. Also as an alternative to jail, 278 defendants took advantage of Electronically Monitored House Arrest, which allows offenders to go to work and probation appointments. By taking advantage of this resource, many offenders are able to keep gainful employment.

Both of the Diversion Programs saw an increase in referrals in 2010. The Driving under Suspension (DUS) Diversion Program continues to assist defendants who have been cited with Driving under Suspension offenses in getting their driver's license reinstated. There were 204 referrals. 85 of which successfully reinstated their license. 60 cases in the Diversion program were not able to obtain a valid license and therefore were placed on Community Control. 59 cases are currently in the process of completing the program. The First Offender diversion program gives defendants who may be charged with offenses such as underage consumption, petty theft and drug abuse the opportunity to amend their behavior and avoid having a criminal conviction on their record. In 2010 there were 104 total referrals to the program, with 35 cases pending and 61 completions. As part of the First Offender program, defendants have the option of participating in the Food Intervention Program. This program has the defendants purchase items on a pre-determined shopping list and then donate the goods to local food banks. This enables the defendants to give back to the community. They also have the opportunity to donate their time through Community Service Work at local non-profit agencies.

At the direction of the Judge, the Community Control Department utilizes many social service agencies and support groups within the community and is always adding more resources for the defendant. The Finish First Program has been a great resource for many first time criminal offenders. Attorney William Dawson developed and now facilitates the program that educates and informs the community about the legal system thus working to stop destructive behaviors and increase decision making skills. 87 defendants were referred to this program.

For the last five years the Berea Municipal Court has been one of the locations for the Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) Driver Awareness Sessions. These sessions include five tiers that cover various topics such as alcohol education and victim and family impact. The cost of the program is \$25.00 (paid by defendants) for each tier and the proceeds go directly to MADD to assist victims of alcohol related driving offenses. 459 defendants were referred to the MADD Driver Awareness Sessions.
